Summer Vacation 2017 with Study Island

Objective:

Study Island Summer Program is a way for students to review all the standards they learned over the course of a year in Math, Reading, and Science. Students who meet the minimum requirements will be rewarded at the beginning of the 2017-2018 school year. Teachers will create the assignments and activate them on the last day of school.

Rules:

Grades 1-3: must pass a minimum of 10 assignments (5 Math and 5 Reading) and/or must have spent 10 hours completing the assignments.

Students may repeat lessons they completed throughout the school year.

Grade 4: must pass a minimum of 12 assignments (4 Reading, 4 Math, and 4 Science) and/or must have spent 12 hours completing the assignments ***Students may repeat lessons they completed throughout the school year.***

Deadline:

Students must complete these assignments by September 18th, 2017.
